Civilian Welfare Fund Logo Contest

The Civilian Welfare Fund Logo Contest is open to all Department of the Army civilians employed at Fort Belvoir. Enter as often as you wish by creating an original logo design for the new name of the organization, Civilian Employee Fund (CEF), which becomes effective Oct. 1, 2000.

The design must be an original work, created by the entrant and available for sole use by the CEF. Entries must be submitted in black and white on 8 ½ x 11 paper with the logo on the top center of one side and the name, address and phone number of the entrant on the bottom center of the opposite side. The logo should not measure larger than 1 ¼ x 1 ¼. The logo must bear no resemblance to official DOD logos. All entries will be judged on their originality, uniqueness, style and representation of the CEF by a panel of judges selected by the Civilian Welfare Fund Council. In case of duplicate entries, ties will be broken by reference to postmarked date. The decision of the judges will be final.

All entry materials become the sole property of the Civilian Welfare Fund and will NOT be returned. The winner will be required to execute a letter authorizing the CEF to use the winning design and the winner's name and likeness for possible publicity purposes.

All entries must be mailed to the Civilian Welfare Fund, LOGO Contest, 5820 21st Street, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060-5937 postmarked NOT LATER THAN Aug. 4, 2000. More than one entry may be mailed in the same envelope. Faxed, hand carried and E-mailed entries will not be considered. The winning entry will be selected at the Aug. 17, 2000 Civilian Welfare Fund Council meeting. The winner will be notified by phone and/or first-class mail. If the winner does not respond within 15 days an alternate will be selected.

The Grand Prize is \$50 cash. First and second runners up name and likeness may be used for possible promotional purposes.

No responsibility will be assumed for lost, misdirected or late mail.
